Casablanca Shawl

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Cascade's Casablanca yarn not only has beautiful color combinations, but the striping is even and thus, it is easy to knit a shawl that has the same stripe combinations on both sides.

Sizes: One Size
34 (38, 42, 46)" – finished garment chest measurement

Gauge: 16 sts – 4" in garter stitch

Materials: Cascade Casablanca (48% Wool, Silk, Mohair) - yards – 2 skeins

U.S. 10 (6 mm) – 32" circular needle

Spare circular needle, in U.S. 8 (5 mm), 9 (5.5 mm) or 10 (6 mm) – to hold sts

Pattern Notes:

The shawl is worked in garter stitch (knit in every row) and is worked from the side toward the center. Once the center is reached, stitches are saved, to be worked later and an equivalent looking second side is worked. Once both sides are completed, the center stitches are connected with a simple Kitchener stitch.

Before starting, ensure that both skeins are at the same color starting point. If you have to cut and separate one skein to match the other skein, simply "spit-slice" the yarn ends together.

Garter Stitch - knit all sts, every row.

Abbreviations:

st/sts	stitch/stitches
CO	cast on
WS	wrong-side row

RS	right-side row
K	knit
P	purl
Kfb	Knit front and back of st (1 st increased)

Directions:

First Half:

CO 5 sts.

Set-up Row 1 (RS): K all sts.

Set-up Row 2 (WS): K all sts.

Row 1 (RS): K2, Kfb, K to end of row. (1 st increased)

Row 2 (WS): K all sts.

Repeat Rows 1 & 2 until there are 85 sts on the needles.

End with a WS row, and leave sts on a stitch holder or spare needle.

Second Half:

CO 5 sts.

Set-up Row 1 (RS): K all sts.

Set-up Row 2 (WS): K all sts.

Set-up Row 3 (RS): K all sts.

Row 1 (WS): K2, Kfb, K to end of row. (1 st increased)

Row 2 (RS): K all sts.

Repeat Rows 1 & 2 until there are 85 sts on the needles.

Connect Both Halfs:

Use the Kitchener stitch designed for garter stitch to connect both shawl halves.

Finishing:

Weave in any ends, block to shape. Enjoy!
